Just FYI-Wisconsin's maximum blood alcohol concentration limit is 0.08% and the limit is strictly enforced. However, a person can be under the influence of alcohol and in violation at lesser concentrations. Your best bet? Avoid alcohol altogether while riding. You are required to provide a sample of your breath or blood if an officer has probable cause to believe you are operating a snowmobile under the influence. By operating a snowmobile on areas open to the public you have automatically consented to provide a sample of your breath, blood or urine to an officer who requests the test. If you refuse to provide a breath, blood or urine sample, you will be charged with an additional violation. Due to recent legislation, riding with a detectable amount of an illegal drug has been enhanced.

Change of address—Within 15 days of changing your address, you must notify the DNR in writing, stating your new address and the certificate number for the machine you own. At the same time you must write your new address on the registration certificate.

Junked snowmobiles—If you are going to junk a snowmobile, write “Junked” across the face of the certificate and return the certificate to the DNR.
